Orthodox Vocabulary

Time

Time: the familiar word but transfigured by biblical revelation and liturgical experience. The economy of salvation includes several "times": the beginning of time, the course or unfolding of time (beginning with the promise), the fullness of time (see Gal 4:4), the last times (or "eschatological" times), which are the time of the Church and the liturgy, and, finally, the consummation or fulfillment of time (the second coming of the Lord). The language of the Bible also distinguishes "decisive moments" (kairoi) within the time of the economy; see Chapter IV, note 3. On the new time begun by the resurrection of Christ and its sacramental celebration see Chapter XIII.

Epistle II Corinthians 6:16-7:1

The Reading is from Saint Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians. BRETHREN, we are the temples of the living God; as God said, "I will live in them and move among them, and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. Therefore come out from them, and be separate from them, says the Lord, and touch nothing unclean; then I will welcome you, and I will be a father to you, and you shall be my sons and daughters, says the Lord Almighty." Since we have these promises, beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from every defilement of body and spirit, and make holiness perfect in the fear of God.

Gospel Luke 5:1-11

At that time Jesus was standing by the lake of Genesaret. And he saw two boats by the lake; but the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. And Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; henceforth you will be catching men." And when they had brought their boats to land, they left everything and followed him.
