THE FIRST ANTIPHON

When Israel went out of Egypt, and the house of Jacob from among a barbarous people; Judah became His sanctuary; Israel His dominion.

Refrain: Through the intercessions of the Theotokos, O Savior, save us.

The sea beheld and fled: Jordan turned back. What aileth thee, O sea, that thou fleddest? And thou Jordan, that thou didst turn back? (***Refrain***)

Glory... Both now... (***Refrain***)

THE SECOND ANTIPHON

I am filled with love, for the Lord will hear the voice of my supplication. For He hath inclined His ear unto me, and in my days will I call upon Him.

Refrain: Save us, O Son of God, Who wast baptized by John in the Jordan, who sing to Thee: Alleluia.

The pangs of death have encompassed me; the perils of hades have found me. Tribulation and sorrow have I found, and I called upon the name of the Lord. (***Refrain***)

Merciful is the Lord, and righteous; and our God hath mercy. (***Refrain***)

Glory... Both now... O, only begotten Son and Word of God...

THE THIRD ANTIPHON

O give thanks unto the Lord, for He is good; for His mercy endureth forever. Let the house of Israel now confess that He is good; for His mercy endureth forever. Let the house of Aaron confess that He is good; for His mercy endureth forever. Let them now who fear the Lord confess that He is good; for His mercy endureth forever.

During the Little Entrance, after the verses of the Third Antiphon, chant the Apolytikion of Theophany. The Eisodikon (Entrance Hymn) is “O come, let us worship... save us, O Son of God, Who art risen from the dead...” as on ordinary Sundays. After the Little Entrance, sing these hymns in the following order:

RESURRECTIONAL APOLYTIKION IN TONE SIX

When Mary stood at Thy grave, looking for Thy sacred body, angelic powers shone above Thy revered tomb; and the soldiers who were to keep guard became as dead men. Thou led Hades captive and wast not tempted thereby. Thou didst meet the Virgin and didst give life to the world, O Thou, Who art risen from the dead, O Lord, glory to Thee.

APOLYTIKION OF THE THEOPHANY OF CHRIST IN TONE ONE

When Thou, O Lord, wast baptized in the Jordan, worship of the Trinity wast made manifest; for the voice of the Father bore witness to Thee, calling Thee His beloved Son. And the Spirit in the form of a dove confirmed the truth of His word. O Christ our God, Who hast appeared and enlightened the world, glory to Thee.

APOLYTIKION OF ST. THEODOSIOS IN TONE EIGHT

The barren wilderness thou didst make fertile with the streams of thy tears; and by thy deep sighing thou hast given fruit through thy struggles a hundredfold. Accordingly, thou hast become a star for the universe, sparkling with miracles. Therefore, O righteous Father Theodosios, intercede with Christ God to save our souls.

TROPARION OF THE DORMITION: TONE 1

In giving birth, Thou didst keep Thy virginity and in thy repose, Thou didst not forsake the world, O Theotokos, for Thou art the mother of life, and Thou didst pass over into life; and through thy intercession from death Thou dost redeem our souls.

KONTAKION OF THE THEOPHANY OF CHRIST IN TONE FOUR

*(**The original melody**)*

On this day Thou hast appeared * unto the whole world, * and Thy light, O Sovereign Lord, * is signed on us who sing Thy praise * and chant with knowledge: Thou hast now come, * Thou hast appeared, O Thou Light unapproachable.

THE EPISTLE

(For St. Theodosios the Cenobiarch)

*Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His saint.
What shall we render to the Lord for all that He hath rendered unto us?*

The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Hebrews. (13:7-16)

Brethren, remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the Word of God; consider the outcome of their life, and imitate their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever. Do not be led away by diverse and strange teachings; for it is well that the heart be strengthened by grace, not by foods, which have not benefited their adherents. We have an altar from which those who serve the tent have no right to eat. For the bodies of those animals whose blood is brought into the sanctuary by the high priest as a sacrifice for sin are burned outside the camp. So Jesus also suffered outside the gate in order to sanctify the people through His own blood. Therefore, let us go forth to Him outside the camp and bear the abuse He endured. For here we have no lasting city, but we seek the city, which is to come. Through Him then let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that acknowledge His Name. Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.

THE GOSPEL

(For the Sunday after Theophany)

The reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew. (4:12-17)

At that time, when Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew into Galilee; and leaving Nazareth he went and dwelt in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulon and Naphtali, so that what was spoken by the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled: “The land of Zebulon and the land of Naphtali, toward the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles—the people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned.” From that time Jesus began to preach, saying, “Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.”

Ladies Society News

As the Ladies of St Mary Church in Pawtucket RI begin the New Year, we have a very ambitious calendar for Fundraising and Outreach in our community. Our efforts reach so many, Locally, Nationally and Globally.

On February 1st, we are holding our Annual Soup-er Bowl of Caring Fundraiser where you can enjoy up to 10 different soups and the proceeds will help fund our Box Lunch program. We have raised over \$30,000.00 for the SOup-er Bowl of Caring during these past 25 years. Before we started the Box Lunch Program we would send the funds to local Soup Kitchens/Food Pantries but this gives us a chance to partner with our Teens to give Back to the Community. Our parish packs 65 lunches on the last Sunday of each month with many of our Teens, the lunches are then brought to the Pawtucket Soup Kitchen. This act of kindness affords the workers Soup Kitchen a day off but it costs us approximately \$200.00 per month to create these lunches. We continue to be generous and offer this program to the Soup Kitchen through the generosity of our parishioners.

During February and March we will continue to collect coats, hats, gloves, scarves, socks, sweats, blankets, etc for our Warm Our Neighbor project. We have been very successful with this collection for the past several years and helped many in our community. Our collection is not only in the winter months but we also do collections in the Summer months for Backpacks, toiletries, gift cards and baby items for the homeless and also the Blackstone Valley Advocacy Center for Women & Children. A Collection Box will be placed in the entry of the Parish Center.

During March we will participate in Antiochian Women Ladies Month activities where we will perform Vestry duties Ushering and Collecting Trays, Reading the Epistle and hosting a Dinner to support the National Antiochian Women (NAB) Endowment project for Widow Clergy Wives.

Lastly we will be having an Easter Bake Sale of Arabic Pastry and treats to help fund Tuition for Lorda. Lorda is a young girl in Palestine who we met when on a trip with Fr Constantine Nasr several years ago. We Ladies have committed to funding her school tuition through graduation from High School. Lorda's Tuition has been \$1100.00 per year and we are praying for her and her family during these difficult times.

Please plan on Supporting the Ladies as we hold fundraisers for our Outreach to the Community.

Dear Brethren in Christ,

On Sunday, January 25, 2026 the Annual Parish Meeting will be held. This year four vacancies (three elected and one appointed) on the Parish Council must be filled. Please remember the following guidelines for service on the Parish Council:

1. No siblings or husband and wives will be allowed to serve at the same time.
 2. Each candidate must be actively practicing the faith and discipline of the Holy Orthodox Church. This means that in addition to supporting the maintenance of the Church through Christian pledges the candidate must be regular and consistent in their attendance at Divine Liturgy and participation in the Sacramental Life of the church.
 3. Anyone willing to be nominated from the floor at the annual Meeting must have met these prior guidelines and must also have secured the approval and blessing of the Pastor at least two weeks prior to the Annual Meeting.
- Those members who are presently serving terms on the Council must meet the same canonical requirements.

Please do review these guidelines. The nominating committee of the Parish Council will be preparing a list of qualified and eligible candidates to be submitted at the Parish meeting.

THE SYNAXARION (Plain Reading)

Theodosios the Great lived in Palestine. The founder and organizer of cenobitic (communal) monasticism, as a young man he visited Simeon Stylites, who blessed him and predicted for him great spiritual glory. Once Theodosios founded his monastery, many monks of different nationalities and languages quickly gathered around him. He built churches for each language group, but on a day when they were to receive Communion, all the brethren gathered in the great church. Together with Saint Sabbas, he defended Palestine from the heresy of the Monophysites. God endowed Theodosios with the gifts of wonderworking, to heal the sick, to be present and help from a distance, to tame wild beasts, among other gifts. Theodosios entered peacefully into rest in the Lord in the year 529, at the age of 105.

On this day, we also commemorate the Venerable Theodosios of Philotheou monastery on Athos; and Venerable Agapios of Apamea in Syria. By the intercessions of Thy saints, O Christ God, have mercy upon us. Amen.
