# DIVINE LITURGY VARIABLES ON SUNDAY, JANUARY 18, 2026

## TONE 7 / EOTHINON 10

### ATHANASIUS AND CYRIL, PATRIARCHS OF ALEXANDRIA & TWELFTH SUNDAY OF LUKE

MARTYR THEODOULA OF ANAZARBUS AND HER COMPANIONS;  
MAXIMOS, SERBIAN RULER

During the Little Entrance, chant the Resurrectional Apolytikion. The Eisodikon (Entrance Hymn) is “O come, let us worship... save us, O Son of God, Who art risen from the dead...” After the Little Entrance, sing these hymns in the following order:

### **RESURRECTIONAL APOLYTIKION IN TONE SEVEN**

Thou didst shatter death by Thy Cross, Thou didst open paradise to the thief; Thou didst turn the sadness of the ointment-bearing women into joy. And didst bid Thine Apostles proclaim a warning, that Thou hast risen O Christ, granting to the world the Great Mercy.

### **APOLYTIKION OF SS. ATHANASIUSS AND CYRIL IN TONE THREE**

(\*\**Thy confession*\*\*)

Shining forth with works of Orthodoxy, \* ye quenched every false belief and teaching \* and became trophy-bearers and conquerors. \* And since ye made all things rich with true piety, \* greatly adorning the Church with magnificence, \* Athanasius and wise Cyril, ye justly found Christ God, \* Who through your prayers doth grant Great Mercy unto all.

### **TROPARION OF THE DORMITION: TONE 1**

In giving birth, Thou didst keep Thy virginity and in thy repose, Thou didst not forsake the world, O Theotokos, for Thou art the mother of life, and Thou didst pass over into life; and through thy intercession from death Thou dost redeem our souls.

### **KONTAKION OF THE PRESENTATION OF CHRIST IN TONE ONE**

Thou, O Christ God, Who by Thy Birth, didst sanctify the Virgin's womb, and, as is meet, didst bless Simeon's arms, and didst also come to save us; preserve Thy fold in wars, and confirm them whom Thou didst love, for Thou alone art the Lover of mankind.



## **THE EPISTLE**

(For Ss. Athanasius and Cyril)

*Blessed art Thou, O Lord, the God of our Fathers.  
For Thou are justified in all that Thou hast done for us.*

***The Reading from the Epistle of St. Paul to the Hebrews. (13:7-16)***

Brethren, remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the Word of God; consider the outcome of their life, and imitate their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever. Do not be led away by diverse and strange teachings; for it is well that the heart be strengthened by grace, not by foods, which have not benefited their adherents. We have an altar from which those who serve the tent have no right to eat. For the bodies of those animals whose blood is brought into the sanctuary by the high priest as a sacrifice for sin are burned outside the camp. So Jesus also suffered outside the gate in order to sanctify the people through His own blood. Therefore, let us go forth to Him outside the camp and bear the abuse He endured. For here we have no lasting city, but we seek the city, which is to come. Through Him then let us continually offer up a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that acknowledge His Name. Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God.

## **THE GOSPEL**

(For the Twelfth Sunday of Luke)

***The reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke. (17:12-19)***

At that time, as Jesus entered a village, He was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance and lifted up their voices and said, “Jesus, Master, have mercy on us.” When He saw them He said to them, “Go and show yourselves to the priests.” And as they went they were cleansed. Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; and he fell on his face at Jesus’ feet, giving Him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. Then Jesus said, “Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine? Was no one found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?” And He said to him, “Rise and go your way; your faith has made you well.”

Dear Brethren in Christ,

On Sunday, January 25, 2026 the Annual Parish Meeting will be held. This year four vacancies (three elected and one appointed) on the Parish Council must be filled. Please remember the following guidelines for service on the Parish Council:

1. No siblings or husband and wives will be allowed to serve at the same time.
2. Each candidate must be actively practicing the faith and discipline of the Holy Orthodox Church. This means that in addition to supporting the maintenance of the Church through Christian pledges the candidate must be regular and consistent in their attendance at Divine Liturgy and participation in the Sacramental Life of the church.
3. Anyone willing to be nominated from the floor at the annual Meeting must have met these prior guidelines and must also have secured the approval and blessing of the Pastor at least two weeks prior to the Annual Meeting.

Those members who are presently serving terms on the Council must meet the same canonical requirements.

Please do review these guidelines. The nominating committee of the Parish Council will be preparing a list of qualified and eligible candidates to be submitted at the Parish meeting.



## St. Mary Church School & Teen SOYO News

### THE SYNAXARION (Plain Reading)

These wise teachers of truth and defenders of Christ's Church share a joint Feast in recognition of their dogmatic writings which affirm the truth of the Orthodox Faith, correctly interpret the Holy Scripture, and censure the delusions of the heretics. Athanasius took part in the First Ecumenical Council when he was still a deacon. He surpassed everyone there in his zeal to uphold the teaching that Christ is consubstantial (homousios) with the Father, and not merely a creature, as the Arians proclaimed. This radiant beacon of Orthodoxy spent most of his life in exile from his See, because of the plotting of his enemies. He returned to his flock as he was approaching the end of his life. Like an evening star, he illuminated the Orthodox faithful with his words for a little while, and then reposed in 373. Cyril was the nephew of Patriarch Theophilus of Alexandria, who educated him from his youth. He succeeded to his uncle's position in 412, but was deposed through the intrigues of the Nestorian heretics. He later resumed his See, however. Cyril presided at the Third Ecumenical Council in 431, which censured the Nestorian blasphemy against the Most Holy Theotokos. His wise words demonstrated the error of their false doctrine. Cyril departed to the Lord in 444. On this day, we also commemorate the Martyr Theodoula of Anazarbus and her companions; and Maximos, the Serbian ruler. By the intercessions of Thy saints, O Christ God, have mercy upon us. Amen.
